What? We are studying the feasibility of utilizing a lane change assist technology intervention, on the simulated driving of individuals with Parkinson's disease.

The study: Involves 6 visits to the research lab (approx. 30 each). Participation will involve responding to a few questionnaires, paper and computers tests; and completing a drive on our **Driving Simulator**.

You may be eligible if:

- You are 21 years of age or older
- Have been diagnosed with Parkinson's disease
- Hold a current and valid G driver's license
- Are proficient in English

Drivers will have the opportunity to practice their driving skills in a safe way, via a driving simulator. Also, they might gain awareness on critical errors made while driving. This study will have no impact on your driver's license.

Participants will receive a gift card of choice, a gas voucher, and parking passes while on our premises.
